
Mountain Community Center Under Construction

Genealogy Center

Preparations are underway for the 7th year of the Genealogy Center at the Deuce. We are preparing an exhibit similar to the woodwork exhibit of Alfred Hanson we had last year. Thanks go to **Tim & Susan Sigurdson Powers** for the use of their house again this year. They are helpful with many ideas and chores to make the Genealogy Center work. The Icelandic Communities Association's "**Cousins Across the Ocean**" project is in its third year. It is becoming well known as a catalyst of encouraging good Icelandic and North American relations. We offer a genealogy search to visiting Icelanders to find their western cousins and introduce them via email and hopefully at the "Deuce" or the Gimli celebration. **George Freeman, Pam Furstenau, and Hálfðan Helgason** of Iceland are the primary researchers for the project.

We have received several requests this year from Icelanders for information on western cousins.

1. **Jón M. Gunnarsson & Jóna H. Karlsdóttir** from Iceland are looking for cousins who are **descendants of Hallur Ólafsson (1853-1937)**. Emigration 1903, Lived in MB (1903-1922), Lived in CA (1922-1937). Made contact with cousin **Hallson & Gayle Rickman** of Stoney Mtn., MB. They will meet in Gimli or Winnipeg.
2. **Jóhann Kristján Ragnarsson** from Iceland is looking for cousins who are descendants of **Einar Stefánsson Scheving (1790-1829?)**. **Melvin & Karen Kristjanson, Loretta Bernhoft, and Doreen Marston** will be some of the cousins meeting Jóhann at the Deuce of August 30 July 2010.
3. **Rut Hansen** from Iceland is looking for cousins who are descendants of **Jón Sigvaldason (1838-1927)**. Jón lived in North Dakota 1892-1899, Pine Valley, MB 1899-1906, and Blaine, WA 1906-1937.
4. A son **Ellis Johnson** (1891-1960) lived in Point Roberts, WA. A grandson **Melvin E. Johnson** (1921-2004) lived in Bellingham, WA.
5. **Eymar Y. Ingvarsson** from Iceland is looking for cousins who are descendants of **Margrét Rósa Jónsdóttir** (1854-1923) and her brother **Halldór Jón Jónsson** (1874-?). Both lived in Winnipeg, MB area. Made contact with cousins **Michael Deildal** of New Westminster, BC., **Bruce & Betty Arnason** of Gimli, MB, **Debbie & Barry Tustin** of Sandy Hook, MB, **Carol & Bill Aitkin** of Gimli, MB, **Muriel Macdonald** of Nepean, ON, and **Joyce & Gordon Robb** of Winnipeg, MB.
6. **Gudmundur Sigurvin Hannibalsson** from Iceland is looking for cousins who are descendants of **Dagbjartur Guðmundsson (1889-1979) & Sigurður Guðmundsson (1887-1979)**. Cousins **Lyle Gudmundson** and **Lance Gudmundson** of Minneapolis have been contacted.
7. **Kristján Sigurðsson** from Iceland is looking for cousins who are descendants of **Eiríkur Sigurðsson (1875-1952) & Sigurborg Sigurðardóttir (1889-1949)**. Author and "Cousin" at the Deuce

A great granddaughter of Pembina County Icelandic Pioneers is bringing her book tour to the Deuce!

Christina Sunley is the descendant of Björn Pétursson and his wife, Ólavia Ólafsdóttir, both buried in the Vikur Church Cemetery and also of Jón Brandsson and his wife, Margrét Guðbrandsdóttir, both buried in Gardar. Christina has written a wonderful book called, "The Tricking of Freya."

This best-selling novelist has just returned from a book tour in Iceland, and will have many stories and images to share during her session. Christina grew up hearing stories about her Icelandic relatives and their journey to North America, following the 1875 volcanic eruption that decimated much of Iceland's farmland. To write "The Tricking of Freya," she spent several years researching Icelandic history, mythology, and genealogy, including three trips to Iceland and a stint as writer-in-residence at Klaustrið (The Monastery), a stone farmhouse in a remote area, near where her grandfather had lived.

"The Tricking of Freya" depicts a young woman who is summoned back to the formative place of her youth, a remote Canadian village called Gimli, where her Icelandic ancestors settled long ago. In Gimli, Freya picks up the thread of a secret--one that leads her through her history and ultimately back to Iceland. Along the way, we learn the story of her early visits to Gimli, the truth about her exuberant, mercurial aunt, and the full scope of a tragedy that shattered her childhood in an instant.

Christina will be signing books in a booth south of the Vikur Church immediately after the Parade on Saturday from 11 – 1:30.

Sunday, she will give a book reading and presentation at 1 p.m. at Borg.

Her grandparents are: Ólafur Björnsson (1869 – 1937) and Sigríður Elínborg Jónsdóttir Brandsson (1889 – 1932). If you are related to either the Björn Pétursson or Jón Brandsson families from Mountain and Gardar, please let Pam know. We will be introducing Christina to her North Dakota "Cousins" at the Heritage Program at 2 p.m. on Saturday.

When we visit the Heritage Center at Icelandic State Park in Mountain North Dakota, the Stephan G. Stephansson monument at Garðar N.D. and K.N.'s (Kristján Niels Júlíus) grave at the ruins of the Þingvallakirkja outside of Mountain, N.D., we are reminded of the past. How Stephan G., one of Iceland's most beloved poets, who lived at Garðar with his family in the 1880's, before moving to Markerville in Alberta, was able to overcome unbelievable difficulties. We are also reminded that this month, on 7 April 2010, 150 years have passed since K.N., who also is one of the most beloved Icelandic poets, was born. He left Iceland in 1878 and lived in Pembina N.D. till his death in 1936.

Last year in June in nearby Grafton, N.D. Kristín Hall celebrated her 100th birthday. She and her generation and many much younger People of Icelandic descent, both in the USA and Canada, still speak Icelandic. "Continued"

She is "Stína litla" in K.N.'s poem. These and many other Icelandic heritage matters are precious; their value cannot be calculated in monetary terms. They must be preserved forever.

There are many ways to preserve the heritage, traditional and new. One new way is the Baggalútur way. Recently the Icelandic Baggalútur band travelled in this area of North Dakota and also above "the line" to Gimli, Manitoba, Canada, and got to know the people there, the descendants of the Icelandic settlers, most of whom left Iceland between 1870 to 1914. They made wonderful modern music to K.N.'s poem for Kristín Hall's birthday. Baggalútur did more than that. "Continued"

The band was so taken by what they experienced during their trip that they produced a whole CD called Sólskinið í Dakota with their fabulous music and singing to K.N.'s and Stephan G's poetry. With Baggalútur, Megas and Gylfi Ægisson also sing on the CD. What a perfect new and old Icelandic harmony ! A modern popular band singing texts of K.N. and Stephan G.

The Embassy highly recommends Bagglútur's CD, Sólskinið í Dakota - "TheSunshineinDakota".

Kitchen Korner

It's the time of year when fresh home grow fruits and vegetables are starting to show up in home gardens. Usually the first thing available is rhubarb, which isn't a fruit or a vegetable. According to Webster's Dictionary rhubarb is a "large leaf plant of the buckwheat family – stalks are cookable but the leaves are poisonous." If you're lucky enough to have a rhubarb plant or two, the following recipe is a tasty way to use it. If you don't have access to fresh rhubarb it is available in the frozen food section of most supermarkets. "Continued"

Rabbararabúðingur

(Rhubarb Custard)

3 ½ cups diced rhubarb
½ cup instant tapioca
¼ teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon vanilla

1 cup sugar (more as needed)
3 cups milk
2 eggs (well beaten)

If using fresh rhubarb discard tops and rinse stems. Cut stems into ½ inch long pieces. Place in saucepan with water to cover. Cook until soft. Drain. Add ½ cup sugar to rhubarb, stirring until it is dissolved. Add more sugar to taste if needed. Set aside. Combine tapioca, ½ cup sugar, milk, salt, and eggs in 1 ½ quart saucepan. Let set 5 minutes. Cook over medium heat, stirring constantly, to a full rolling boil. Remove from heat, stir in vanilla. At this time the two mixtures can be combined and served warm or chilled. Both mixtures can be chilled separately and layered in a trifle bowl with whipped cream. ~~~~~
